1. ANNOUNCEMENT:

The Sunshine Coast MCC hereafter called the PROMOTER will conduct BUSH 2 BEACH MX SERIES (Rd2) - SUNSHINE COAST MCC - 19 April 2026 Motocross at the 1156 Maleny Kenilworth Road, on 18-Apr-26 to 19-Apr-26 as per Permit Applications applied for.

2. JURISDICTION:

The above mentioned event has been authorised by Motorcycling Queensland (MQLD) who has issued the Motorcycling Australia Permit Number MX/26//24561 and is open to holders of current Motorcycling Australia licences.

The event will be held in accordance with the current Manual of Motorcycle Sport General Competition Rules (GCR's) contained in the Manual of Motorcycle Sport, these Supplementary Regulations, and any Final Instructions approved by Motorcycling QLD. By entering this Event all parties agree to comply with these rules, regulations, by-laws and instructions.

If an International Meeting Number (IMN) is approved, competitors with comparable licenses from another FMN who have obtained written clearance and provide verification of personal FIM insurance to a standard accepted by Motorcycling Australia are also eligible to compete.

3. ENTRIES:

Entries open forthwith and close on 14-Apr-26 via Ridernet. Conditions of entries in section 27.

In the case of postponement or abandonment of the event, all or any part of the entry fee may be retained by the Sunshine Coast MCC, if such retention is approved by Motorcycling QLD. Only entries received on the official Entry Form that are accompanied by the correct fee will be accepted.

4. INSURANCE:

National Personal Accident Scheme provides basic cover for death and permanent disability. Ambulance Insurance is compulsory for licensees. **IT IS STRONGLY RECOMMENDED THAT COMPETITORS GIVE CONSIDERATION TO TAKING OUT WEEKLY BENEFITS INSURANCE .**

5. MEDICAL SERVICES:

Best Medical will be in attendance prior to any on track motorcycle activity until 15 minutes after the completion of racing each day.

Should there be insufficient entries in any Class of Competition, the decision to run or cancel the Class, or to combine events and re-distribute any awards, will be at the discretion of the Sunshine Coast MCC, subject to Motorcycling QLD approval.

10. RACE FORMAT:

Motorcycling Queensland (MQLD)
Location: 65 Roderick Street Ipswich QLD 4305
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Practice will be 3 laps per class, in race order. Combined classes, race length and race order are below; classes will be scored separately.

Race lengths may be shortened to complete scheduled events or as circumstances require.

- Junior Lites - 8 minutes
- 65cc 10-u12 - 8 minutes
- Vets 30+ & Vets 40+ - 10 minutes
- 50cc Demo - 7 minutes
- 65cc 7-u10 - 8 minutes
- MX1 Pro/Expert & MX1 Clubman - 11 minutes
- Mini Lites 12-u16 - 8 minutes
- 50cc Auto - 8 minutes
- Mini Lites 9-u12 - 8 minutes
- MX2 Pro/Expert & MX2 Clubman & Women - 11 minutes

Should nominations be insufficient, event officials may decide to run the following classes together. The classes will still be scored separately.

- 65cc 7-u10 & 65cc 10-u12

The club or relevant key officials may vary, alter or suspend the planned race schedule, due to insufficient nominations, in order to complete racing, for the safety of any person present, or for any other reason that warrants such action.

The series will consist of four (4) rounds:

1. Bingera Weir - 29 March 2026 (Rum City MCC)
2. Green Park - 19 April 2026 (Sunshine Coast MCC)
3. Dundowran - 3 May 2026 (Hervey Bay MX)
4. Mundubbera 31 May 2026 (Central Burnett MCC)

The number of laps/time per race at each venue may differ from the numbers advised above. This is to accommodate the different lap times of each venue. Each club will set their race lengths based off the indicated approximate minutes listed above in order to complete the event schedule.

For the purposes of drug and alcohol testing, the commencement of the event will be deemed to be 06:00 AM with the completion of the event for the participant being when the participant has vacated the venue.

All competitors will be given the opportunity to walk and inspect the track prior to any on track participation. This inspection must be done on foot and competitors are reminded that service vehicles may be in operation on the circuit at this time.

Enduro Events - Prior to competition there may be an escorted preliminary lap of the course.

Track dissatisfaction - Competitors who are not satisfied with any aspects of the track can present these concerns to the Clerk of the Course. If those concerns cannot be resolved, the competitor will be invited to withdraw from the event.

12. AWARDS AND PRIZE MONEY:

All demo class rider will receive awards.

Series Awards will be given for 1st, 2nd and 3rd overall placed riders for each respective class. In order to qualify for a series award, riders must compete at all four rounds. Failing to compete at one or more rounds will automatically exclude riders from series awards (regardless of points attained at other rounds).

The clubs also intend to acknowledge the three (3) highest overall placed junior female competitors in each class at each round.

13. PRESENTATION:

Will be held at the Control Tower shortly after the completion of racing.

Series awards will be presented at the final round (Mundubbera).

14. MACHINES AND RIDERS:

All machines entered must comply with the current GCR's for Motocross Competition.

Eligibility checks can take place at any time during the event.

It is the competitor or parent / legal guardians' responsibility to ensure that any machine that suffers accident damage during practice or racing is repaired and will meet the required safety standards as outlined in the MOMS prior to further participation in the event.

Capacity and fuel testing may be utilised by the Scrutineer at any round to assist with machine eligibility.

Helmets are mandatory. All persons including officials using any bike, trike or quad at an event must be wearing a properly secured helmet.



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15. RIDING NUMBERS:

Wherever possible, competitors will be allocated their Registered Riding Number. All Number Plates on all Machines MUST comply with the GCR's for Motocross.

16. GRID POSITIONS:

Grid positions will be first to gate, single row across the start line.

17. RIDER'S BRIEFING:

A rider's briefing will be held at 07:45 AM and prior to any on track motorcycle activity. It is compulsory for ALL competitors to attend. A random attendance roll call may be utilised by the Clerk of Course to determine a competitor's attendance at rider's briefing. The Clerk of Course may at his/her discretion, penalise any competitor who is called randomly at riders briefing and is proven not to be in attendance by not responding to that call.

Smoking is strictly prohibited at Rider's Briefing.

18. STARTS:

19. TYRES:

As per the Manual of Motorcycle Sport for Motocross competition.

20. ANTI-DOPING POLICY:

All competitors, crew, parents / guardians and officials are advised that drug testing may take place in accordance with MA's Anti-Doping Policy, under the authority of Sport Integrity Australia.

Athletes are advised to download the Sports Integrity Australia app. If athletes have any doubts over Sports Integrity Australia requirements they should visit the website www.sportintegrity.gov.au

It is recommended athletes contact the Drugs in Sport Hotline (1300 027 232) for further information. When drug testing takes place, the payment of prize money may be delayed, at the discretion of MA, until the results of the tests are known.

21. DRUG AND OR ALCOHOL TESTING:

All competitors and officials are advised that random drug and alcohol testing may take place during the competition. Refer to MA website for details on the Safety Policy - Drug and Alcohol testing.

22. CODE OF CONDUCT:

All Competitors, Officials and Parents are reminded of the Motorcycling Australia By-Law - CODE OF CONDUCT (as stipulated on the MA website - www.ma.org.au) which is a guide to appropriate behaviour at all Motorcycle Race Events. This CODE OF CONDUCT applies to this Event and will be enforced.

23. ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATIONS AND SOCIAL MEDIA:

All competitors, officials and parents are reminded of MA's Electronic Communications and Social Media Policy (in supp regs) / Social Media Policy (on website), found at www.ma.org.au, which sets out a framework for acceptable online behaviour where communications involve fellow MA members, volunteers, officials, coaches, sponsors, partners, staff and any other connected persons.

24. CODES OF BEHAVIOUR:

All competitors, Officials and Parents are reminded of MA's Codes of Behaviour contained within MA's Member Protection Regulations, found at www.ma.org.au which is a guide to appropriate behaviour at all motorcycle race events. These Codes of Behaviour apply to this event and will be enforced. If a rider is banned from entry at one of the participating rounds/venues, they will not be allowed to participate in that round of the series.

25. SOUND/NOISE TESTING:

Sound Testing may be conducted as per the GCR's.



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26. CIRCUIT DESCRIPTION:

The circuit is natural terrain with some man made features.

27. RESTRICTIONS:

- All bikes being ridden through the pit paddock must be at walking pace (1st gear). Helmets and footwear must be worn.
- All bikes must have numbers - one on the front and one on each side.
 - As per the 2026 Manual of Motorcycle Sport, there have been changes to number plate colours. Please check 18.15.3 in the MoMs for further details.
- As per the 2026 Manual of Motorcycle Sport, all motocross riders (junior and senior) must wear Body Armour type C. "Commerically manufactured upper body protection (front and back(must be worn."

TRANSPONDERS

- Electronic timing (mylaps) will be conducted at this meeting. Transponders will be charged at \$25 each. Transponders can be transferred between bikes, or more transponders can be rented if required.
- If the rider has their own transponder(s) the transponder hire fee will not be applicable. The rider must advise of the correct transponder number(s) applicable.
- Electronic timing is compulsory for all competitors.
- Transponders must be fitted for all practice and racing.
- It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure that the transponder is mounted correctly and securely.
- All competitors are required to provide their MA Licence or other ID in exchange for a transponder.
- When a hired transponder is transferred to the competitor, it then becomes the competitor's responsibility.
- Transponders must be returned to the designated person(s) before they vacate the venue.



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- For transponders not returned on the same day, or not returned to the designated person, late return fees may be charged at \$20 per day. Some leeway may be given in special circumstances.
- Loss or damage to a hired transponder incurs a replacement fee. The promoter is not responsible for any lost transponders.
- Riders may be able to purchase transponder brackets for a \$15 fee at sign on.

28. SPECTATOR FEE'S AND INFORMATION:

There is no entry fee for spectators.

29. SPECIAL NOTES AND WARNINGS:

SIGN ON

- Electronic sign on will be used at this event. You must attend sign on; the following conditions apply:
 - If you are under 18 years of age, you must attend sign on with a parent or guardian.
 - You must bring either your virtual licence (through the Motorcycling Australia app/website), or your hardcopy MA licence.
 - Self scrutineering forms will be used at this event - you must bring your completed self scrutineering form to sign on (which must also be signed by a parent or guardian or those under the age of 18 years).

VENUE INFO

- No firecrackers or fireworks are permitted.
- In the interest of safety there is no riding of any pit bikes, ebikes, balance bikes, scooters ATV's etc. at this event.
- **Tear offs are not permitted** at this venue for environmental reasons. Roll off systems are encouraged.
- Camping is available after noon on Saturday night only.
- Children must return to their campsite by 8:30pm, and noise is to be kept to a minimum after this time.



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- There are to be NO FIRES.
- **No glass bottles** are permitted at Green Park.
- No dogs allowed by order of Motorcycling Australia and Sunshine Coast Council. Guide and Assistance dogs excepted.
- A canteen run by the Conondale P&C will be available during the event.
- Coffee will also be available from the bar beside the canteen.

30. FIRE EXTINGUISHERS:

All competitors should have a minimum 2kg, dry power A: B (E) class, working fire extinguishers in their pit area.
